Whether you watch movies or not, one thing is for sure—by now everyone knows that movies are given ratings as to how bad they are.

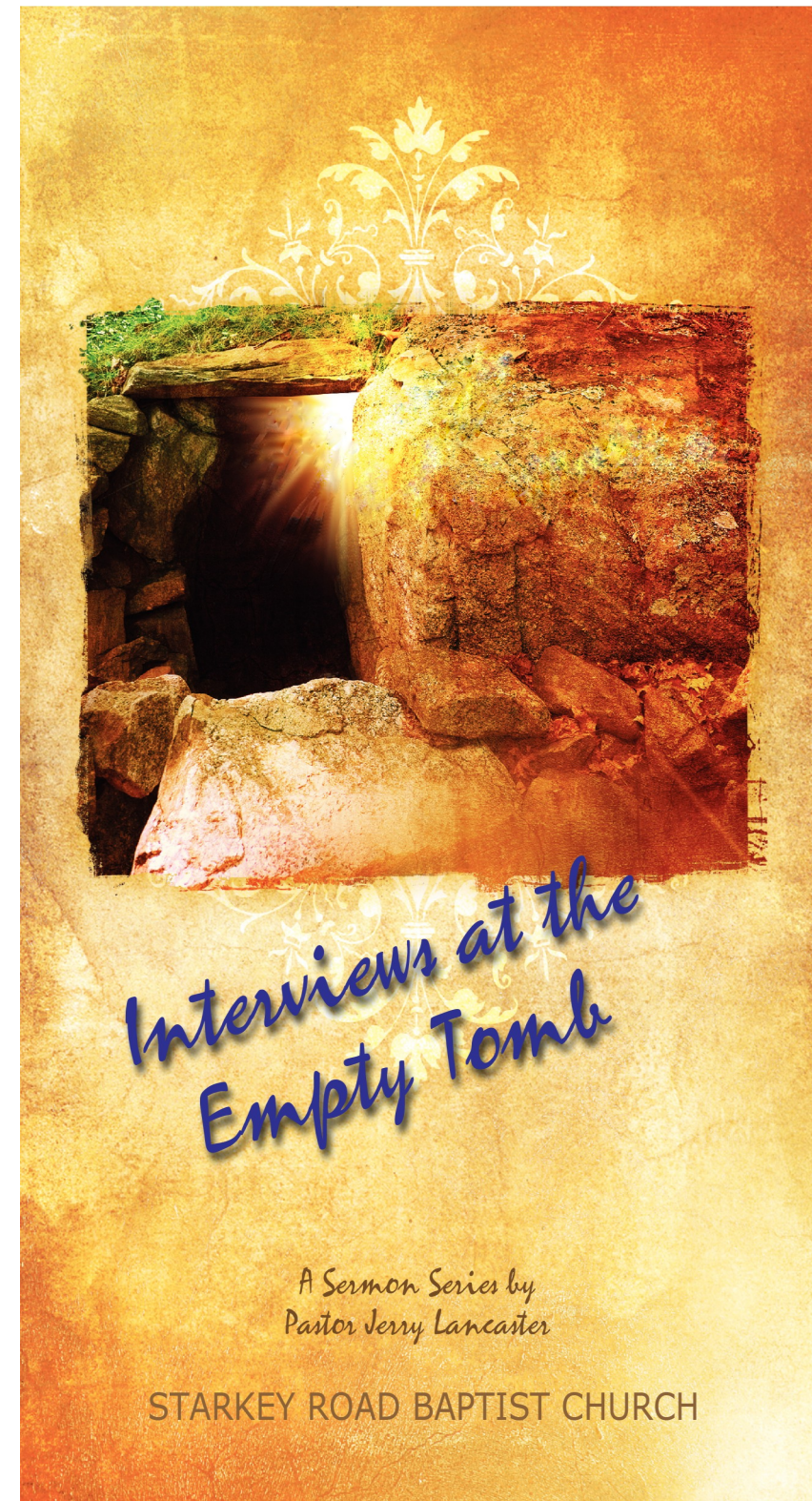
That may sound funny, but isn't that what those ratings mean? You know, they serve as warnings to the viewer as to how much profanity, sexual content, graphic violence, nudity, and a whole list of other vile things that are in a particular movie. Furthermore, we need to remember that the movie industry didn't come up with the G, PG, PG-13, R, and X rating system out of the goodness of their Judeo-Christian hearts. It is not like they were so conscience-stricken that they just had to do something about exposing so many people to so much trash. Truth is, they bowed to pressure from those who felt they had a "moral right" to know ahead of time how filthy the movie would be.

Trouble is, over time, even warning labels can lose their ability to warn. We simply get used to them, like a flashing red light at an intersection through which we travel dozens of times during the week. Very subtly, the red light somehow "loses its flash."

Take, for example, the PG rating. It stands for "Parental Guidance." The letters originally were designed to give a warning. But how many of our kids go to their parents and seek guidance before they watch such a movie? I know what you are thinking...We can hardly expect *them* to do that; it's the *parent's* responsibility to give PG. Okay, I haven't polled the audience, but I do seriously wonder how much PG is really going on out there these days.

All of which leads us to an important reminder: One of the roles of parents is to provide PG. There is even a PG Study Guide to go with it—the Bible. It tells parents to "bring them up in the loving discipline and godly instruction of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4).
