Library Corner

The Pillars of Christian Character, by John MacArthur, is not a new book, but it is timeless. He writes about the transforming power that comes when you exercise biblical attitudes in your everyday life.

Dear Congregation:

Let's do something different in this pastor's note – a case study. And, instead of me tying it up in a neat little package of biblical conclusions, you write the ending.

Case studies are an excellent way to learn. When I was in the College of Business Administration at the University of Cincinnati, our upper class courses were all case studies. By then we had already had a couple of years of accounting, business law, economics, finance, marketing, and statistics. Now it was time to use the business tools we had been taught.

This case study is taken from an article written by Erwin Lutzer several years ago entitled "The Ax to the Root of the Tree." He told of a girl named Karen he met at a youth retreat. She told him that she needed help because "my life is a bit messed up."

She seemed to experience continual failure in her Christian life, especially in five areas: sexual looseness, drinking alcohol, smoking, bad language, and bitterness against her parents.

"As she stared into space," Dr Lutzer says, "I must admit I wasn't fully prepared for the next remark. In tears she said, 'I'll have you know that I've come to Christ ten times with these problems – and He hasn't helped me a bit'."

"Ten times to the One Who claims to deliver people from their sins, but for Karen it hasn't worked?" Dr. Lutzer thought to himself. "There may be hundreds of Karens out there who are trying to live the Christian life with habits they began practicing for kicks in their youth – now they feel ensnared. Some of them have even transferred bitterness toward their parents to their marriage partner. Like Karen, they may have sung "I Surrender All" – but it has not helped much, or for long. They know of God's power, and they've seen our failures, and they wonder where the breakdown between the two occurs."

So, how do we translate God's promises and power into spiritual victory for the Karens out there?
