Library Corner

The Joy of a Promise Kept, The Powerful Role Wives Play is a book written by the wives of twelve Christian leaders. It brings wisdom born of age, experience, and real life. After reading this book, you will be able to encourage and understand your husband better.

Dear Congregation:

Joy and I, along with millions of others, have had treatment of one kind or another for skin cancers. Last week, as Joy got out of the car to enter the dermatologist's office she mumbled, "I should have listened to my dad." Me too, I thought.

I knew what she meant. Way back in the 1960's he read an article by a medical doctor entitled "Don't Envy the Man with the Tan!" Long before the general public was better educated about the dangers of overexposure to the sun's harmful rays, he regularly repeated the headline of that article to us as we went out the door to the beach. We usually returned a polite smile to him as we went our merry way, baby oil in hand. Somehow it didn't seem all that dangerous at the time (and tanned bodies even looked healthy).

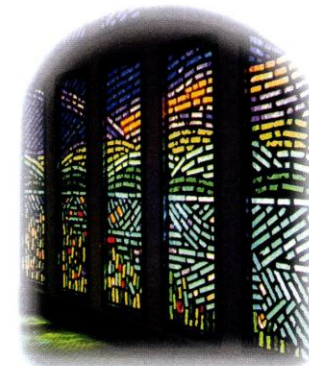
Overexposure. Serious. The damage desensitizes the skin, and eventually causes tiny tumors to form under the skin, which if neglected may become destructive cancers. Subtle, but scary. In the end, surgery is necessary.

But I could not help but think of another form of exposure that is even more damaging – the exposure of our eyes to sordid images. It, too, at first seems insignificant. But it desensitizes our conscience and wars against our bodies, our homes, and our testimony. The solution may require surgery – Jesus said so (Matthew 5:29-30).

Surgery?! Yes, because many Christians are too overexposed today. We need to learn to say no and decide to excise some things from our lives. Our thought processes are largely the result of the stimuli our brain receives from the various senses, i.e. the eyes. How we employ these information gatherers largely determines how we think. And remember: How we *think* will determine how we *live*.
