### Library Corner

If we can't see, hear, or touch God, how does our relationship really work? *Reaching for the Invisible God*, by Philip Yancey, offers deep, satisfying insights that affirm and dignify the questions we're sometimes afraid to ask.

Dear Congregation:

I cut my spiritual teeth on the books written by Dr. M.R. DeHaan, the founder of the Radio Bible Class, headquartered in Grand Rapids, Michigan. For years I have received by mail from RBC Ministries the Our Daily Bread devotional guide and the Discovery Series Bible study booklets. Both have been helpful resources in my walk with the Lord.

One of the latest study booklets is a biographical sketch of the life of C.S. Lewis (C.S. stands for Clive Staples, which helps us understand why he preferred to use only his initials!). I read it, along with several other books, in preparation for today's sermon on the conscience. Lewis, at one time, was an atheist. In his salvation experience he explains how God spoke to him through his conscience.

C.S. Lewis was born in 1898 in Belfast, Ireland. His atheism was shaped in part by personal heartaches, including the painful loss of his mother to cancer when he was a young man.

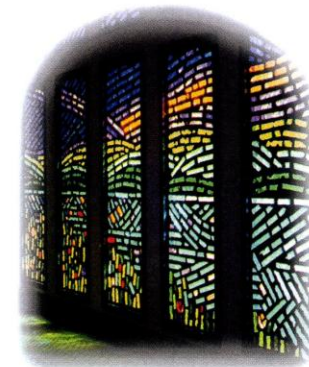
His conversion to Christianity is described as "the conversion of his conscience." He writes about it in *Mere Christianity*, which he begins with the subtitle "Right and wrong as a clue to the meaning of the universe." To Lewis, humans have a universal moral awareness that has its origin in the God who revealed Himself in Christ.

After he became a Christian, his conscience seemed to grow under the influence of his newfound faith. But, his commitment was tested once again in the untimely death of his wife Joy. Through the experience, Lewis would learn that our understanding of God is not just limited to life on earth, but is rooted in the promise of a supernatural existence that transcends death. The promise of heaven caused Lewis to view our present world as only a "shadowland" (where the 1993 movie *Shadowlands*, about his life, got its name).

When C.S. Lewis departed this shadowland for his heavenly home, few of us noted his passing. We were all preoccupied with another untimely death...President J. F. Kennedy... November 22, 1963.
